



### CLASS HISTORY

Five of the Seniors of the graduating class of 1947 have completed all 12 years of school in Viborg. They are Audrey Petersen, Betty Lue Sorensen, Merritt Christensen, Daryl Lund and Herbert Peterson.

The second year was a very quiet one, but during the third year we took in four pupils who have been with us ever since. They are, Cleo Peterson, Dale Peterson, Edward Ostroot and Lois Holm. During this year, Rueben Morck, who started school here, left and attended school in Iowa.

While in the Fourth Grade, a very good looking young lad with black hair entered our school. The girls all sighed when they met Verne Altstiel.

Ardis Christensen and Mavis Bak entered during our fifth year of school here.

There was no new enrollment until in the seventh grade when Marian Christensen and Arleen Madsen came in. Arleen was unable to graduate from the Eighth Grade with the class, due to an illness, which caused her death during the first part of our Freshman year. During this year, Verona Simonsen, who started school here, left to attend country school.

When in the Seventh Grade, this group took an active part in the first banquet held by the Seventh and Eighth Grades. It was held in the school gym under the direction of our teacher Miss Collings. The setting was a circus theme. Merritt Christensen served as toastmaster.

In the Eighth Grade, our second banquet was held. The gym was decorated in a colonial theme.

In the spring, thirteen pupils were assembled for Eighth Grade Graduation. Supt. W. H. Davidsen presented the class with their diplomas.

Then the big day came. Twenty-nine very green Freshmen came nervously up the school steps to start their high school education here. Classes began and what a commotion it was. The girls went with the boys to Shop when they were supposed to be attending Home Economics Class. There were several classes which were not attended that day due to our ignorance. Initiation gave us our legal rights as high school pupils, under the "footsteps" of our upper classmen.

Our Sophomore year was spent rather quietly. We were then just becoming accustomed to being very studious pupils of V. H. S.

Of the many events which took place, during our Junior year, there was the preparation and presentation of the class play, "Ghost Wanted." The proceeds of the play went toward the Junior-Senior banquet which carried out a Star-Light Theme. Robert Mark acted as toastmaster for the evening.

During the first part of our Senior year, one of our classmates, Mavis Bak, passed away.


